From the editor

Bonsai friends

Indications are that there is a very strong El Niño phenomenon developing.

El Niño is a climate phenomenon characterized by unusually warm ocean temperatures in the central and eastern tropical Pacific Ocean, which disrupts global weather patterns. In Southern Africa, including South Africa, El Niño events are associated with below-average rainfall, delayed rainy seasons, prolonged dry spells, and higher-than-normal temperatures. During previous El Niño years, South Africa experienced **significantly reduced rainfall**, particularly in summer rainfall regions. This leads to **drought conditions**, lower river flows, and declining reservoir levels, which can necessitate water restrictions and rationing.

It is therefore logical to accept that it will effect the watering of our bonsai trees. That is a scary thought because most members has trees that are many years old, and we do not want to loose them by not being able to water them.

What can we do?

Think out the box about efficient irrigation techniques. Do not water with a hose pipe. Lots of water does not go onto the trees but onto the ground. Maybe water with a watering can and only pour water carefully onto the trees.

Maybe collect the grey water in your house, that is shower and bath water and even diswashing water, and use that on your trees. Maybe install water tanks and catch the rain water, how little there might be, from the roof, to use.

Bonsai is 'n illusie. Mens skep 'n boom wat 100 jaar en ouer voorkom deur 'n klein boom-
pie te gebruik. Die illusie maak gebruik van sterk wortels, ruwe bas en stamme en “taper”
om 'n hoë boom voor te stel.

Dieselfde word gebruik wanneer 'n bonsai woud geskep word.

Onder is 'n woud van oorlede Charles Ceronio. Die woud is tans by die Pretoria Botaniese
tuine uitstalling. Die woud het oorspronklik 53 boompies gehad, tans is daar net 20 boom-
pies in die woud.

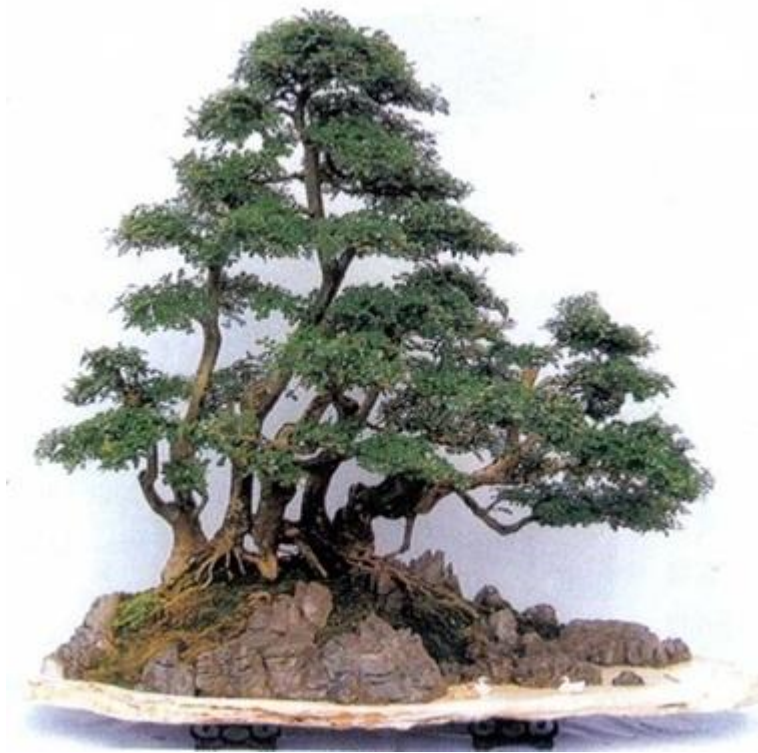
Bonsai woude kan van drie bome tot soveel as wat die kunstenaar verkies wees. Die woud bestaan uit individuele bome.

Hoe repliseer mens die geel woud, of die Kremetart woud, wat onder gewys word as bonsai?

'n Paar Bonsai woude vir bespreking:



In die skepping is die rotse fyn beplan. Die rotse gee 'n idee van hoe groot die bome is. Die illusie wat dus geskep is is dat die bome baie groot is. Dit is 'n vër aansig. Waar staan die kyker in verhouding tot die woud? Die bome volg dieselfde beweging en vorm. Dit gee ook diepte perspektief, daarom bome aan die agterkant. Daar is ook negatiewe spasies. Die plat bak (klip) gee ook die illusie van ruimte, of oopte.

In die skepping is daar meer spasies tussen die bome. Die plat grond oppervlakte gee die illusie dat jy tussen die bome is, jy is naby aan die bome. Daar is 'n groot boom maar die aandag word deur die boom wat deur weerlig getref is getrek. Daar is baie negatiewe spasies tussen takke. Die plat vierkantige bak gee spasie dat die bome tot in die hoeke geplant kan word.

Rotse in 'n landskap moet reg gebruik word. Hier vertoon die rotse groot en laat dit dus die bome ook groot lyk. Dit is ook 'n vêraf aansig wat gehelp word deur die opgehewe grond oppervlakte. Die bome vertoon naby mekaar omdat die kyker vêr staan. Die fokus boom is 'n derde van die kant van die woud. Die bak is vlak en ovaal en skep die illusie van grootte. Die aksente aan die kant skep die illusie van klein boompies in 'n enorme woud.



Nog 'n vêr aansig. Die hoë grond profiel gee die gevoel dat mens opkyk na die groep. Die illusie is nie van enorme groot bome nie maar wel van ou bome. Daar is diepte perspektief deurdat daar boompies agter is. Die hele woud word basies die fokus punt deurdat dit mens trek na agter, diep in die woud in. Die regterkanste hangende tak gee die gevoel dat dit 'n tak is wat oor 'n stroompie hang.

Hierdie woud is groot en dig. Mens sien nie eintlik deur na agter nie. Mens kyk van vêr af na die woud daarom is die grondoppervlakte redelik gelyk. Tog is daar oop dele dat van die bome se stamme gesien kan word. Daar is mooi diepte met van die klein boompies wat agter gesien kan word en dit lok jou om in die woud in te stap. Die hele groep is die fokus punt.



Hierdie woud vertel 'n storie. Jare terug het ek in die ou Oos Transvaal gery net na daar 'n orkaan was en baie bome het omgewaai. Hierdie toneel herinner my aan wat ek daar gesien het. Jou oog word getrek na die oop deel waar die omgevalle bome lê. Die klein boompies regs gee die idee dat hulle weer opgekom en gegroei het.

Hier is die “pot” indrukwekkend en die skepping gee die idee dat dit bome teen ’n heuwel langs ’n stroom is en dan ook teen die anderkant van die stroom. In dié geval is daar korter bome voor. Dit gee balans aan die woud. Die blare “pads” gee die gevoel dat dit op en op gaan.



Hierdie is nie ’n bonsai nie, dalk ’n AI geskepte prent. Dit wys dalk die Serengeti met die oop en ruim wydtes, met min bome, plat aarde. Die perspektief is dat die agterste bome net so hoog, of selfs hoër is as die voorste bome. Kan mens so iets realisties skep?

Hierdie was geskep by een van die BRAT vergaderings. Ek dink die foto was geneem voor alles voltooi was, as mens sien dat daar nog 'n boompie in die agtergrond in 'n sakkie is. Vir my is die linkerkantste groot boom te dominerend en te veel op die kant van die hele skepping. Maar soos gesê, dalk is daar later groter bome bygevoeg.



Indien hierdie werklik 'n bonsai skepping is is die Seringetti goed vasgevang. Die twee groter bome aan die kante kan dalk bieter dieper, na binne, in die skepping wees. Dalk is die skepping te simetries. Daar is 'n gevoel dat ek tussen die bome in die landskap staan.

Raad is dat die woud uit ongelyke getal bome bestaan. Maar na meer as elf bome tel dit nie meer nie. Die rede is dalk dat gelyke getalle maklik simetries kan raak. 'n Japanese miete is dat die getal vier met dood te doen het.

Om 'n landskap te maak is moeiliker as om 'n enkel boom te maak. Dit is nie maklik om genoeg, asook die regte bome, te kry nie. Die regte bak/pot is ook 'n uitdaging. Spesies met klein blaartjies moet verkieslik gebruik word.

Na die aanbieding en bespreking het Carl 'n baie mooi klein woud geskep met Vye boompies. Die boompies is voor die tyd bietjie bedraad. Carl het klippies onder in die bak geplaas. Hy het ook 'n groei mengsel met meer kompos in as gewoonlik gebruik, om meer vog te hou omdat die bak so plat is. Carl het 'n stuk gaas, wat hy met draad vasmaak aan die bak, onder in die bak geplaas. Hy maak dan die boompies aan die gaas vas. ♣

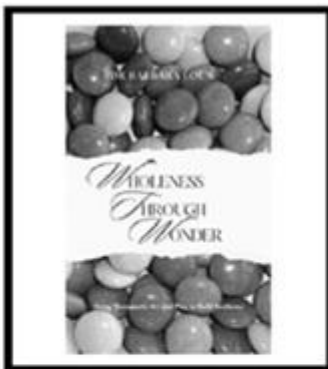

Anton noem dat hy basies in 'n kwekery groot geword het. Hy het van jongs af saam met sy pa grondmengsels getoets vir geskiktheid vir die plante in die kwekery. Hulle het sowat sewe mengsels vir verskillende potplante getoets, waarvan bemesting ook by sommige mengsels gevoeg was. Hulle het komersieële mengsels, soos Culterra of Braak produkte, ook later getoets en gebruik.

Wat is die basiese vereistes vir 'n groeimengsel?

1. Dreinerings.

- Swak dreinerings veroorsaak wortelvrot.
- Wortels het suurstof nodig.

2. Vog retensie

- Vog retensie het baie met die medium se korrelgrootte te doen.
- Die spasies tussen die korrels word deur water gevul en as die water gebruik is kom daar weer suurstof in. Die voghouding is dus die oorbrugging tussen droë tye.
- Die medium moet aangepas word afhangende hoe gereeld mens water kan gee. By die kwekery kon tot ses keer per dag water gegee word.

3. Gewig

- Gemak van hantering. Te swaar is moeilik om te dra. Te lig kan die plant omwaai in die wind.
- Stabiliteit van die plant (boom) in die houder.

4. Anker

- Vanselfsprekend - is albasters goeie anker?
- Medium moet verskillende deeltjies groottes bevat

5. Voeding

- Groeimedium self kan voeding gee, soos dolomiet asook organiese materiaal
- Indirek deur voedingstowwe vas te hou en vry te stel

6. pH

- Plante soos Azalea wat lae pH verkies. As blare geel is is die medium nie suur genoeg nie.

7. Buffer

- Water is deur die dag nodig. As jy in die oggend natgooi moet daar genoeg vog gehou word tot die middag.
- Selfde met voeding. Moet kan terughou en oor tyd vrystel.

8. Stabiliteit van groeimedium

- Hoe vinnig breek dit af
- Hoe gereeld wil ek verplant
- Verfyning van medium en moontlike verswakking van eienskappe

Progress history of trees

At the Japanese festival I showed a small Trident Maple (*Acer buergerianum*) which was in its autumn colour. I was asked by someone about the progress and history of the tree and decided to show it in the Koeda.

I request that any reader who has similar records of trees to submit it to the editor please.

Trident Maple progression: by Jaco Kriek

The start

I was given a very small tree by a Kai member in 2009. The tree was in a black bag and the member grew it from seed. I unfortunately do not have a photo of it then. In Januarie 2012 I planted the tree against a rock. I again replanted it in 2015 into a plastic bucket, photo right. I must say at that stage I had no idea where I was going with it.



The main growth was in the apex of the tree. In September 2018 I replanted it again into a larger plastic container and I removed most branches, except for a little bit in the top. In hind site I should have cut it back harder. Photo showing the growth in the apex.

Photo on the right taken in Oktober 2018 when I planted it into a growing bucket and the way I cut off most branches.

In August 2020 I replanted it again into the same growing bucket. The tree had a lot of roots and was somewhat rootbound. I also removed the one large root that was bothering me as well as some top growth, photo below.



In Augusts 2024 I replanted it again and trimmed the branches much shorter. I was only now starting the visualize where I possibly wanted to go with the tree. Photos below.

By October 2025 it has grown well. It made long thin branches which I cut to the first or second leave, photos below. I defoliated the tree in December 2025.

January 2026 it was looking good with new leaves, below. Autumn 2026 it made the best autumn colors it has ever made. I don't know why and I wish I did know because I would like to do the same for the future. Because of the autumn colour, I showed it at the Japanese festival.



My future plan is to keep it very much as it is. I will regularly trim and defoliate the tree in order to get fine ramification and small leaves. To me it is a natural looking tree and I plan to make it like the tree on the right, which is a tree in nature. ♣

Die onderste foto van die werk en hoe die boompie daarna gelyk het was in die vyfde uitgawe van 2018 van die Koeda geplaas.



By die vergadering van 1 Augustus 2026 het Christa die boompie op die mini uitstalling gewys. Christa behandel die dooie hout met Olyfolie en glo dat die olie die dooie hout beskerm en dit gee ook 'n baie mooi donker kleur aan die dooie hout. Ses jaar later se versorging en die boompie is mooi en gesond. Wys weereens dat bonsai tyd neem en dat mens maar geduld moet hê. ♣

Wat doen ons in September?

Met die aanbreek van September kom die lente en warmer weerstoestande. Die meeste bladwisselende bome moes nou reeds uitgeplant of herpot en die wortels teruggesnoei gewees het. Vir sommiges, byvoorbeeld Witstinkhout en die Akasias, moet 'n mens verkieslik wag totdat hulle bot, maar herpot voordat die botsels oopgaan. Die meeste immergroen bome kan nog tot in vroeg September herpot word. Wildevye se wortels moet verkieslik nie gesnoei word voordat temperature verhoog nie. Blomplante soos Azaleas moet nie herpot of gesnoei word voordat die blomme afgeval het nie. Jenewers kan ook nou herpot word alhoewel hulle 'n langer herpotperiode het, tot diep in die lente. Moet nooit boompies wat pas wortelsnoei en herpotting ondergaan het, te gou begin bemes nie. Dit kan die pas gesnoeide wortels beskadig. Beskerm boompies wat herpot is teen die laaste koue wat mag voorkom.



Hou bome wat bedraad is fyn dop, veral takke wat uitermatige groei toon. Verwyder alle bedrading indien nodig en wees baie versigtig om nie die delikate nuwe groei te beskadig nie.

Soos temperature verhoog, neem groei toe en is dit nodig om watertoediening en voeding te verskerp.

Wat doen ons in Oktober?

Teen Oktober bevind ons ons in die tweede maand van die lente en die warmer weer laat die boompies verseker vinniger groei. Onthou dat die beste manier om digte vertakking te verbeter, opgesluit lê in voortgesette snoei. Groeipunte kan voortdurend uitgeknyp word, behalwe waar 'n tak verleng moet word. Wanneer uitloopsels begin verleng, kan hulle teruggesnoei word tot een paar blare. Dit sal kompakte groei bevorder. By naaldboutboompies kan kerse tot tweederdes teruggeknyp word.

Met al die nuwe groei en 'n toename in watertoediening moet voeding nie agterweë bly nie. As jy vinniger groei in jong plante wil aanmoedig, gebruik 'n produk met 'n hoë stikstofinhoud, maar by die handhawing van meer gevestigde bome, waar ons nie wil hê die blare moet vergroot nie, kan 'n produk gebruik word wat weer hoër kalium en fosforinhoud bevat met 'n laer stikstofinhoud.

Behandeling teen peste kan ook 'n aanvang neem aangesien skadelike insekte en swamsiektes hulle verskyning kan maak.
